Candidate filing in Auburn will take place at 2956 Richardson Drive in Auburn on Mondays, Wednesdays, and the last Friday of the candidate filing period from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that filing began Monday, November 13, 2023, and will close Friday, December 8, 2023, after which time no Declaration of Candidacy may be accepted for filing. If an incumbent does not file their Declaration of Candidacy on or before December 8, 2023, the period for all non-incumbents to obtain and return their nomination and declaration paperwork will be extended to December 13, 2023.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that Placer County has moved to the Voter's Choice Act starting at the Presidential Primary Election. This means Placer County will have a few vote centers open ten days before Election Day and the remaining vote centers opening the 3 days before Election Day. During this period, vote centers will be open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day. Voters will no longer have an assigned polling place and can go to any vote center throughout the County on any of the aforementioned days. On Election Day, all vote centers will be open from the hours of 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
