

★ ★ ★ POLL WORKER REMINDERS ★ ★ ★

- ★ You are representing Placer County, conduct yourself in a professional manner and be courteous, patient, helpful and respectful to all voters, observers, and other Poll Workers at all times!
- ★ You will be assigned to a polling place which will be open for voting from 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. You are expected to arrive one hour prior to opening and are expected to remain on site (except during breaks) until released by your Inspector.
- ★ Dress appropriately and comfortably. No tank tops, halter tops, shorts, torn clothing, flip flops or open toed shoes. No Political or offensive slogans, buttons, hats, or stickers of any kind!
- ★ Members of the precinct board include an Inspector, a Judge and Clerks/Student Clerks. The Inspectors lead, supervise, and delegate duties to their board and ensure all procedures are being followed in accordance with state law.
- ★ Meals are not provided. Your Inspector will assign you break times, but you may want to bring snacks and water to last throughout the day.
- ★ No food or drinks are allowed at the precinct board table, around voting equipment or ballots. (water is ok but keep away from electronic devices and ballots.)
- ★ There is no smoking allowed at any Polling Place.
- ★ No internet/Wi-Fi capable devices, cells phone or laptops are allowed while working. If you need to check your phone, take a quick break, and go to a private area where voters are not voting.
- ★ The voting process may be observed by others, but observers may not interfere with the privacy of voters or Poll Worker duties.
- ★ No electioneering (political campaigning) is allowed within one hundred feet of the Polling Place entrance. No newspapers, radios, television, campaign literature or clothing are allowed in the Polling Place.
- ★ If you have any questions or concerns throughout the day do not hesitate to ask/talk to your Inspector, Rover, or the Elections Office.
